Hester Katz Memorial Award for Art Therapy Students

This award was initiated by the AATQ to honour the memory of one of our founding members and the creator of our logo. The original award was \$200. Since 2002, the family of Hester Katz has generously contributed to this fund which now totals \$450. In recognition of Ms Katz's desire for excellence, this grant is awarded to an art therapy student for superior achievement in research.

Any student member in good standing of the AATQ who is currently enrolled in an art therapy training program may submit one paper to the competition. To be eligible, the paper must meet the following criteria:

- 1 Include a cover page stating the student's full name and address, current student status, name of university or training program, phone number;
- 2 Be concerned with a topic relevant to art therapy and explore a theory or point of view;
- 3 May be illustrated with 1 to 3 illustrations. Only photographs or photocopies permissible, no slides. Illustrations are strongly recommended, however if papers are not illustrated, the reason for the omission must be provided;
- 4 Be 12 to 20 pages in length, typewritten, and double-spaced;
- 5 Conform to the American Psychological Association (APA) style;
- 6 Be written in French or in English.

The papers will be adjudicated by a Reader's Committee whose comments will remain confidential to the committee and whose decision is final. The paper will be judged on clarity, style, originality and subject matter. The selected paper will be published by AATQ in the forthcoming year and the award presented at the Annual Conference. Consent to publish must accompany the submission.

This is the opportunity for you to consider the value of your work and to prepare a submission to the Ad Hoc Committee. This is an occasion to be recognized by peers and professionals both within and out of the Association. **Your submission must be postmarked by June 1st.**
